

FEED MILL INDUSTRY: MANAGEMENT SALARY SURVEY 2020 EDITION

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A Brief Introduction

Since 2002, Continental Search has been recruiting in animal nutrition, helping both commercial and integrated companies find great talent. Many of the positions for which we recruit are in feed milling. We created this survey in 2019 for our clients and interested management professionals to allow them to make smart decisions when drafting an offer letter, getting salaries in line with the industry or when choosing to negotiate compensation for a new job. 2020 is our second year for this survey, and I would like to thank the participants for taking time to respond during the pandemic.

Each year we reach out to nearly 1000 feed mill managers, assistants, superintendents, and multisite managers across the USA. Last year almost 100 responded with 60 of them being mill managers. In 2020 we had 84 respondents, with 53 being feed mill managers, down due to the extraordinary demand placed on feed mill managers during the COVID-19 pandemic.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- Responses are actual anonymous responses.
- Respondents provided their total compensation instead of base salary providing a clearer picture of earnings.
- · We rounded the numbers for easy reading.
- This report is divided with integrated companies first and then commercial mills.
- · This is our second annual survey for this field.

COMBINED ANALYSIS

- 61% of respondents have a college degree. This is representative across all job titles.
- Of our respondents, 17% were multi-site managers, 63% were feed mill managers, 11% were assistant managers, 8% were superintendents, and 1% were foremen.
- 64% of the respondents work in commercial mills and 36% work for integrated mills.
- · This breakdown is very similar to last year.

FACTORS INFLUENCING COMPENSATION

Other than tonnage and location, these factors influenced compensation compared to the average

- Tenure (increases)
- States having low/no income tax (decreases)
- Responsibility for a budget/Profit and Loss (increases)
- Ability to outperform industry norms (increases)

Of the 11 respondents, 55% of these multi-site managers have college degrees. Incomes for this group break down as 27% at \$90K-\$100K, 18% at \$100K-\$110K, 18% at \$110K-\$120K, and one each at \$140K-\$150K and one over \$150K.

61% of these feed mill managers have college degrees. The majority are in the Midwest (42%) and the Upper Midwest (23%). Regarding compensation, 35% earned \$90K-\$100K followed closely by 13% earning \$80K-\$90K, 13% earning \$100K-\$110K, and 13% earning \$110K-\$120K.
