## **Biden Priorities**

COVID pandemic



- Stimulus package & infrastructure development
- Climate change re-entering Paris Climate Agreement
- Extend Affordable Care Act
- Regulatory reviews
- Foreign policy re-entering multilateral agreements
- Expect Executive Orders



## **Trump on Trade**

- Unilateral pressure on China
- Preference for bilateral agreements
- Pushed for WTO overhaul
- Increased pressure on EU
- Tariffs served as "go-to"
- High priority





#### **Under Biden: Trade Priorities Will** Shift

- Be more predictable
- "Fix" relationships
- Keep tariffs on Chinese goods, but use coalition approach
- Unclear if trade agreements will be prioritized
- Shift to multilateral agreements





## **Key Cabinet Positions for Ag**

- Biden intends to assemble a Cabinet "diverse in both ideology & background"
- Former Sec Tom Vilsack will play a selection role

- EPA
  - Mary Nichols, Heather McTeer, Jay Inslee
- USTR
  - Ron Kind, Darci Vetter





#### WTO

- Doha Round stalled
- Reform needed



- U.S. actively blocking WTO appellate body
- Director general challenges
  - o U.S. ag industry shared desired qualifications
  - WTO prepared to appoint former Nigerian Finance Minister Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala
  - U.S. govt opposed; backed South Korean Trade Minister Yoo Myung-hee



## WTO Reform

- U.S. proposes to reform criteria for special & differential treatment
- Divisive issue
- Critical to addressing negotiation paralysis
- Next director general will be key to its success








## **WTO Challenge Brewing**

- U.S. ag. domestic support for 2019-20 likely to surpass WTO limits by \$10B
- If temporary, US may avoid adverse ruling or retaliation
- One of Biden's first ag challenges

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#### **China Phase One Agreement**

Market access for:

- Poultry & poultry products

   Signed regionalization protocol for HPAI
   Newcastle Disease
   New pet food facility reg. protocol
- Feed additive, pre-mix & compound feed transparency
  - For product registration/renewals
  - For <u>facility</u> registrations











#### **China Phase One Agreement**

- Phase one implementation should lead to tariff reductions
- Purchases of agricultural products are essential to success



#### **China Phase One Results So Far**





- China purchased \$23.6B worth of U.S. farm commodities (*goal* = \$36.5B)
  - First rice sales shipped last week
  - o Corn, soybeans, sorghum, pork, beef, pet food, alfalfa, pecans, peanuts
- 50 of 57 technical commitments completed



## **China Looking Forward**

- Biden unlikely to lift tariffs quickly
- Likely to demand concessions similar to Trump's Curbing subsidies to state controlled enterprises End forced transfer of technology Opening digital services markets Address IP theft
- Policy concerns



Likely to work in country coalitions



## **United Kingdom**

- Brexit effective Jan. 31, 2020
- Fifth round of talks concluded
- Jan. 1 is deadline for a hard exit




- Biden has indicated that if the UK opts for no deal & withdraws from the Northern Ireland protocol, there will be no U.S. trade deal
- An opportunity to make inroads in Europe
- Feed industry issues: biotechnology, science-based standards, cont'd govt. interaction post-deal



## Kenya

- Highlighted by Trump admin. as potential trading partner/template for other African country negotiations
- Status
  - 2nd round underway; anticipated to conclude Nov. 12
  - Subsequent round scheduled in December now uncertain
- Will Biden continue interest?
- AFIA exploring other opportunities in Africa







#### All about enforcement

- Labor enforcement and funding
- Auto rules
- Dairy provisions



## India

- Mini deal could provide access for ag
- India has signaled it is ready to sign
- Potential for full FTA





#### Japan

- Phase 1 completed, but controversial
- Phase 2 would address
   SPS issues





#### Brazil

- Unlikely in the next few years
- Agreement on Trade and Economic Cooperation updated





### **European Union**



- Becoming very unlikely
- Contentious issues include lobsters, civil aircraft disputes & U.S. complaints over EU's farm to fork policy & geographic indicators
- Biden will likely begin reviewing tariffs on EU goods for removal



## **Trade Promotion Authority**

- Gives Congressional authority to the President to negotiate
- Expires July 1
- Last renewal took eight years
